

SCHOOL PE & SPORTS FUNDING 2017-2018

At Millhouse Primary school and nursery, we recognise the contribution of PE and sport to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

Our Primary School PE and Sport's Funding will enable us to continue and extend our provision through employing additional sports professionals, entering into more competitive sports competitions and training our staff to deliver in-house quality PE sessions.

What is the Sports Premium?

The PE and sport premium is a government funding stream designed to help primary schools improve the quality of PE and sport activities they offer. Schools receive PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6. Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year.

Purpose of the funding

The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2016 to 2017 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

AIMS FOR 2017-2018

- Continue to offer a wide range of sporting clubs
- Participate in more competitions with both Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 pupils.
- We will be looking at including more unusual sports into our curriculum opportunities
- Subsidise transport to and from sporting events
- Liaise with a local secondary school to offer pupils an even more varied range of sporting and physical activities.
