Dear Parents / Carers,

End of Term and Plans for September

We are writing to let you know what our plans are for the end of term and moving forward.

Bubble Groups

All bubble groups will finish on Thursday 16th July. This is to enable us to hold some transition sessions before the end of term.

Key Worker / Vulnerable Groups

These groups will finish on Wednesday 22nd July.

Transition Arrangements

We are working on plans to be able to have the children meet their new teacher during the last three days of the term (20th, 21st & 22nd July). This will be for children in the current years R – 5. We will confirm how this will work in the next week.

Children who are joining us in nursery and reception in September will have separate transition arrangements which will be communicated directly to these parents.

Summer Holidays

The government have confirmed that schools are to be closed completely during the summer holidays. This is to ensure all staff can have a proper break and be fully rested for September (most staff have not had a break since February half term) and to allow the school to be thoroughly cleaned. This will also mean that the key worker groups **will not** be running during the holidays.

Home Learning

Google Classroom will continue to be updated until the end of term. During the last week of term, we will be sending home a range of activities that can be completed and enjoyed by the children and their family. There will be no work set on Google Classroom during the holidays so that all the children can have a break as well.

September...

All we know at the moment is what the Prime Minister announced last week – which is he expects all children to be returning to school full time in September. We do not know what this will look like and are waiting for the guidance for schools to be published in the next week or so. Whatever plans we put in place will be driven by our risk assessments. As soon as we receive the guidance and have confirmed plans, we will let all parents know. Hopefully this will be before the end of term; however, if we do not get the guidance in time, it might be during the holiday.

We are very much hoping that we can return to some kind of normality in September and will be looking forward to seeing all of the children return as soon as it is possible.

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Thank you all for your continued support and cooperation during these unprecedented times. It has been difficult for everyone not being in school and seeing all the children but we have come this far and will continue to do our best for the children no matter what happens.
