Find a poem about autumn. Can you learn it to tell to your class? Or you could have a go at writing your own!

Go bird watching. What birds did you spot? Draw and label them.

Twit-twoo! Go on a night time walk. What animals can you see or hear?

Learn to read the number words from one to ten. You could challenge yourself to spell them too!
